#### CORRECTIONS REPORT(MOLLY)

-Requesting check for 30\$ written out to Club 12 for rent for the Corrections Committee meetings. (This used to be \$10 quarterly but we are currently meeting monthly, rather than quarterly.)

- The committee had a Corrections Workshop on April 12 in Eleva. The workshop was very successful, in that all questions and concerns from potential Trempealeau County Jail volunteers were addressed. However, there were no Trempealeau County Jail volunteer applications filled out, despite several reminders and requests. At this time, the people who were interested in volunteering at the Trempealeau County Jail are considering whether or not they can make the commitment to the jail. Applications have been disbursed to AA meetings in the area by Pat C. and there has been no interest from any of the AA members at those meetings yet. Pat will be in touch with Molly if anyone does complete an application, or show any interest in volunteering at the Trempealeau County Jail.

-The Corrections chairperson has been regularly receiving the Bridging the Gap forms from inmates in the surrounding jails and prisons for many years, and will continue to do so. The Bridging the Gap forms from inmates continue to get mailed to the Corrections Committee's P.O. Box, which is funded by the district. Gabriel K. attended the Corrections Committee meeting, as the Intergroup Bridging the Gap chairperson. He reported that the Bridging the Gap committee has been inactive

since the committee was formed by the Intergroup. Gabriel K. volunteered to assist with the Bridging the Gap portion of the Correction Committee's responsibilities, since the Intergroup Bridging the Gap committee continues to be inactive. Thank you for your service Gabriel!

-The Corrections Committee is continuing to seek volunteers for any jails in district 05. If you are interested, please contact Molly M @ 715-577-0847. Please spread the word!

-The committee has decided to meet monthly, until some of the bridging the gap questions are resolved, for all people concerned. If you have input, suggestions, questions, or concerns, please join us next month, the first Wednesday of every month at Alano Club 12 (small building) at 7:45. All are welcome to attend!

#### **PUBLIC INFORMATION REPORT (MYRON)**

The committee held a regular bi-monthly meeting March 19th at the River Falls Alano Club with 6 members in attendance. We reviewed the two schools project-related workshops held in Eau Claire and River Falls. We now have 27 volunteers signed up to help with this project. An initial email outreach to the schools in the district has not brought any responses as yet. Volunteers are beginning school visits in the Eau Claire area, and efforts in the Menomonie and River Falls areas are expected to begin before the end of May.

We also reviewed and discussed the relevant PI agenda items for the Area 74 Delegate's Workshop held in Three Lakes, WI on March 29th. As committee chair, I attended that event and took part in the PI discussion, which lasted nearly six hours. Much of the time was taken up with discussion of issues related to current and future television public service announcements (PSAs) -- the production, distribution, and free airplay of these short AA films on commercial TV outlets throughout the US. In recent years, AA has contracted with an outside distributor to handle this process, and now has much more accurate information on which videos resonate with the market in any given area of the country. This information will help AA create better and more effective PSAs as we attempt to reach still-suffering alcoholics nationwide.

On Thursday evening, May 8th, I took part in a conference call with Area 74 PI committee members. The discussion centered on issues related to anonymity in electronic media; specifically, how the Area website can be used to better inform members about AA business conducted at Area-wide events or committee meetings while maintaining the anonymity of those members serving those bodies. The potential for anonymity breaks comes not so much from the actions of individuals, but from internet search engines. A password-protected area of the website will be developed to contain reports and meeting minutes from Area gatherings. These documents, which will necessarily identify AA members by name, would be available for members only to view. The details of how the password would be disseminated within AA, and how often it would be changed, have yet to be worked out.

The District 05 PI Committee will hold its next meeting Wednesday, May 21st at 6:30pm at the River Falls Alano Club. All interested AA's are encouraged to attend. On the agenda for the meeting will be: continuing progress of the schools project; revisiting the project to provide local AA information to hotels and motels in our district; and members' ideas for new committee efforts. I request reimbursement for \$9.03 spent to purchase AA pamphlets for the schools project.
